

Scenario 4: Student is NOT in good academic standing (is ON academic probation) yet will not receive “SAP academic probation warning”

Total attempted hours: 13

Total passed hours (this semester): 13

For this 13-hour semester, the student has a 1.78 grade point average and will be placed on first-semester academic probation (for not achieving an overall gpa of 2.0 or higher).

Interestingly enough, even though the student IS on academic probation, he/she will NOT receive a SAP “academic probation warning.” Why? Because by the end of this semester the student has indeed passed (with mixed results) 100% of his/her overall attempted hours: $13 \div 13 = \text{SAP ratio of } 100\%$ (above the required 67%).

Remember, “SAP academic probation warning” is not the same thing as actual academic probation. It does NOT count as a semester of academic probation but CAN impede progress towards graduation and COULD negatively impact financial aid eligibility (contact the Office of Financial Aid for more information). It is an alert that the student needs to take action to improve academic progress towards graduation and sometimes academic performance.
